

Tom Evans has been Assistant Director of Music at St Paul's School in London since September 2009. A violinist, taught by Carol Slater and Christopher Hirons, he has performed concertos with a number of amateur orchestras and he leads Fulham Symphony Orchestra. He is also a composer, having graduated with a music

degree from St John's College, Cambridge, and having gained a PhD in composition from King's College London where he was supervised by Silvina Milstein. Before teaching at St Paul's, Tom taught undergraduate courses in music analysis and twentieth-century music at Royal Holloway and King's College London.



Violinist Marsha Ford made her first solo recital debut in 2011 in Krakow, Poland. She has since performed in Germany, France, Italy, Spain and London and has open invitations to perform in Boston, USA and Norway. Marsha has just completed her Artist Diploma Course at the Royal College of Music with Professor Radu Blidar. At the age of just 12 Marsha was awarded The Castiel Winser Trophy and bursary presented to the most

promising stringed instrumentalist under 18 at the Gibraltar Festival for Young Musicians. As well as her significant performance experience, Marsha also has a love for teaching and she spent her gap year shadowing her former teacher Natalia Boyarsky at the Yehudi Menuhin School. Marsha Is a Visiting Music Teacher at St Paul's Juniors and she also teaches a number of private students across London.
